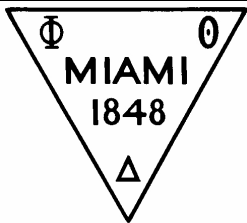

We received a list of all the Phis in the central Florida area that were eligible for recognition pins. Thank you again, and my very best wishes to all of you.
